# **REMEDIAL POLICY**

## 1. Introduction

Jamia Nadwiyya Arts and Science College (JNASC) recognizes that students may face academic challenges throughout their studies. This Remedial Policy aims to provide a supportive and structured framework to identify and assist students experiencing academic difficulties, enabling them to achieve their academic goals and succeed in their chosen programs.

### 2. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Identify students experiencing academic difficulties early on.
- Provide timely and appropriate support to students needing remediation.
- Offer a range of remedial measures tailored to individual student needs.
- Ensure that remedial efforts are integrated with the College's academic programs.
- Promote a culture of academic support and success within the College.

#### 3. Scope

This policy applies to all undergraduate and postgraduate students enrolled in JNASC academic programs.



# 4. Definitions

- **Remedial Measures:** Additional academic support, such as tutoring, workshops, study skills training, or supplemental instruction, designed to help students improve their academic performance.
- Academic Difficulty: A student's inability to meet the minimum academic standards for a course or program, as evidenced by poor grades, incomplete assignments, or failure to meet other academic requirements.
- Academic Advisor: A faculty member assigned to provide academic guidance and support to students.

## 5. Identification of Students in Need of Remediation

Students experiencing academic difficulty may be identified through:

- Poor performance on assignments or exams.
- Low attendance in classes.
- Failure to complete assignments or projects.
- Referral from faculty members or academic advisors.
- Self-identification by students seeking academic support.

## 6. Remedial Measures

JNASC will offer a variety of remedial measures to students in need, including but not limited to:

• Individual or group tutoring.



- Workshops on study skills, time management, and exam preparation.
- Supplemental instruction sessions.
- Referral to academic advisors for personalized guidance and support.
- Mentoring programs.
- Access to online resources and learning materials.

### 7. Implementation

The implementation of remedial measures will follow these steps:

- 1. **Identification:** Students experiencing academic difficulties will be identified through various means, as mentioned earlier.
- 2. **Notification:** Students identified will be informed about their academic standing and the available remedial measures.
- 3. **Referral:** Students will be referred to appropriate remedial resources based on their individual needs.
- 4. **Monitoring:** The progress of students receiving remedial support will be monitored regularly to assess their improvement and adjust the support if necessary.
- 5. **Evaluation:** The effectiveness of remedial measures will be evaluated periodically to ensure they are achieving their intended goals.

### 8. Responsibilities

• **Students:** Students are responsible for actively participating in remedial measures and seeking support when needed.



- Faculty: Faculty members are responsible for identifying students in need of remediation and referring them to appropriate resources. They should also participate in remedial efforts by providing tutoring or supplemental instruction.
- Academic Advisors: Academic advisors are responsible for guiding students through the remedial process, offering personalized support, and monitoring their progress.
- **Remedial Staff:** Staff involved in remedial programs are responsible for providing high-quality support to students, monitoring their progress, and evaluating the effectiveness of remedial measures.
- College Administration: The College administration is responsible for providing the necessary resources and infrastructure for remedial programs, ensuring their proper implementation, and evaluating their overall effectiveness.

# 9. Confidentiality

All information regarding a student's academic difficulties and participation in remedial measures will be treated with strict confidentiality, in accordance with the College's privacy policies.

# 10. Review

This Remedial Policy will be reviewed periodically by the College's Academic Council to ensure its effectiveness and relevance to the changing needs of students.
